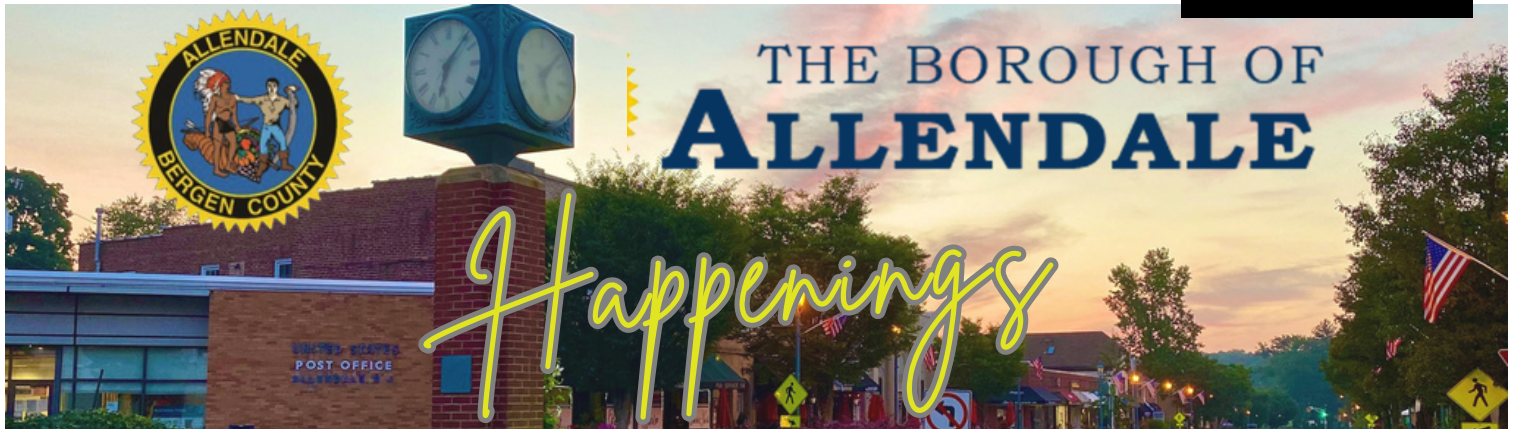

A MESSAGE FROM MAYOR AMY WILCZYNSKI

We are already here in mid-August! Allendale has been especially quiet this month, many residents are on vacation time before our busy fall schedules begin.

While things may be a little quieter around town, Borough Hall and I have been busy preparing for Q3. Keep an eye out for updates on important topics including **water, sewer and sidewalks**. Please make sure you are signed up on the Borough website to receive email updates and important notices. Some upcoming events worth noting:

August 20 – Book Reading with the Mayor

Join me at the Community Center at 1:00 p.m. for a special book reading for kids. Bring your favorite stuffed animal!

September 8 – Ice Cream with the Mayor & Allendale Police

Come to Borough Hall after school from 3:00–5:00 p.m. for ice cream and some time with members of the Allendale Police Department and me.

September 11- 9/11 Candlelight Ceremony

This year marks the 25th anniversary of the attacks on our country. Please join us for this very moving and important event.

7 pm @ the 9/11 memorial at the Red Barn

September 15 – Town Hall #3

Join us at the Community Center for our third Town Hall of the year. I'll provide updates on all things Allendale and address questions submitted through our survey. As always, we welcome your input!

I recently attended the **NJ League of Mayors meeting**, where one of the major topics of discussion was the continued **increase in healthcare costs**. Municipalities are once again facing increases of approximately 20%. This is something mayors across New Jersey are watching closely. If changes to the state health plan do not occur soon, we are looking at ways municipalities can work together, including forming committees and banding together to find solutions.

Later this month, I will attend another Mayors meeting focused specifically on **navigating challenges with utilities**. The session will be led by a former President of the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities (NJBP) and is intended to provide mayors with practical tools we can bring back to our communities. I will certainly share what I take away from the meeting.

Another issue I am watching very closely is the Governor's recent **Executive Order #17**, which is focused on accelerating housing production. While this is different from the Fair Share Housing process and does not require a quota, it sends a clear signal that the state intends to increase housing production and reduce barriers for developers, including zoning and permitting requirements that we have in place to protect the character of our town.

This is a moving target, and we need to stay informed and proactive. Our success in the fourth round of Fair Share Housing demonstrates what can happen when we find creative solutions that protect Allendale. I will continue to monitor these developments closely and stay a strong advocate against these flawed initiatives.

Please mark your calendars for two amazing community events in September:

September 19 – America's 250th Celebration Continues!

Our downtown will be filled with fun and patriotic activities as we continue celebrating America's 250th anniversary with the Holiday Observers. **"Main Street" will close early at 11:30 a.m.** for the parade! There will be face painting, food, music and more for families. **The parade kicks off at 12:15 p.m.** and will feature floats, horse and carriage, bagpipers, stilt walkers and plenty of surprises! The parade will lead to **Crestwood Park**, where the Holiday Observers will continue the celebration with reenactments, music, food and lots of family fun.

September 26 – Allendale Day from the Chamber of Commerce

Join everyone **downtown from 12:00–4:00 p.m.** for one of Allendale's favorite traditions. Allendale Day will feature arts and crafts, face painters, food trucks, unique vendors, music and more. And as the sun goes down, the **Holiday Observers Fireworks Show** will commence over Crestwood Lake!

There is a lot happening in Allendale this fall, and I hope to see you and your families at many of these events. Enjoy the rest of the summer, and as always, thank you for allowing me the opportunity to serve as your Mayor.

Don't forget to call Veolia to install your Smart Meter. This is required by the NJBP. Call (800) 422-5987 to make an appointment.

Your Allendale Green Team continues our 3rd Saturday Monthly Collection through the Summer months. The next collection date is Saturday, September 12, from 10 AM – 12 Noon at Borough Hall. Just look for our tent and banner (pictured above) as you enter the parking lot.

We collect the following items EVERY month:

- EPS Packing Foam "Styrofoam"
- Household batteries (disposable and rechargeable)
- Plastic Film (grocery bags, bubble wrap, shipping envelopes, bread bags, paper towel wrap etc.)
- Clothing
- Reusable Shopping Bags
- Non-perishable Food Donations

We also sell:

- Compost Bins @ \$60.00
- Compost Tumblers @ \$75.00
- Rain Barrels @ 70.00
- Food Waste Pickup Service @ \$22.50 per on demand pickup of 5 gallon bucket via Neighborhood Compost

REMINDER FOR COMPOSTERS!

Backyard composting is limited to vegetables, fruits, coffee grinds, loose tea. In a backyard bin, you CANNOT compost meat, fish (or their bones), dairy products, oil and grease.

The pickup service provided by **Neighborhood Compost** accepts **ALL FOOD WASTE**, allowing you to compost any and all leftovers from your kitchen included soiled paper napkins and paper towels, greasy pizza boxes, egg shells, meat, fish, bones, moldy cheese, spoiled milk products, cooking oils, etc.

PLEASE contact the Green Team via AllendaleGreenTeam@gmail.com for information about a pilot program to encourage subscription to the Neighborhood Compost service through a subsidized subscription. You will be amazed at the reduction of trash placed at the curb. Composting is the most natural and beneficial way to handle food waste. Feed the Farm NOT the Landfill!

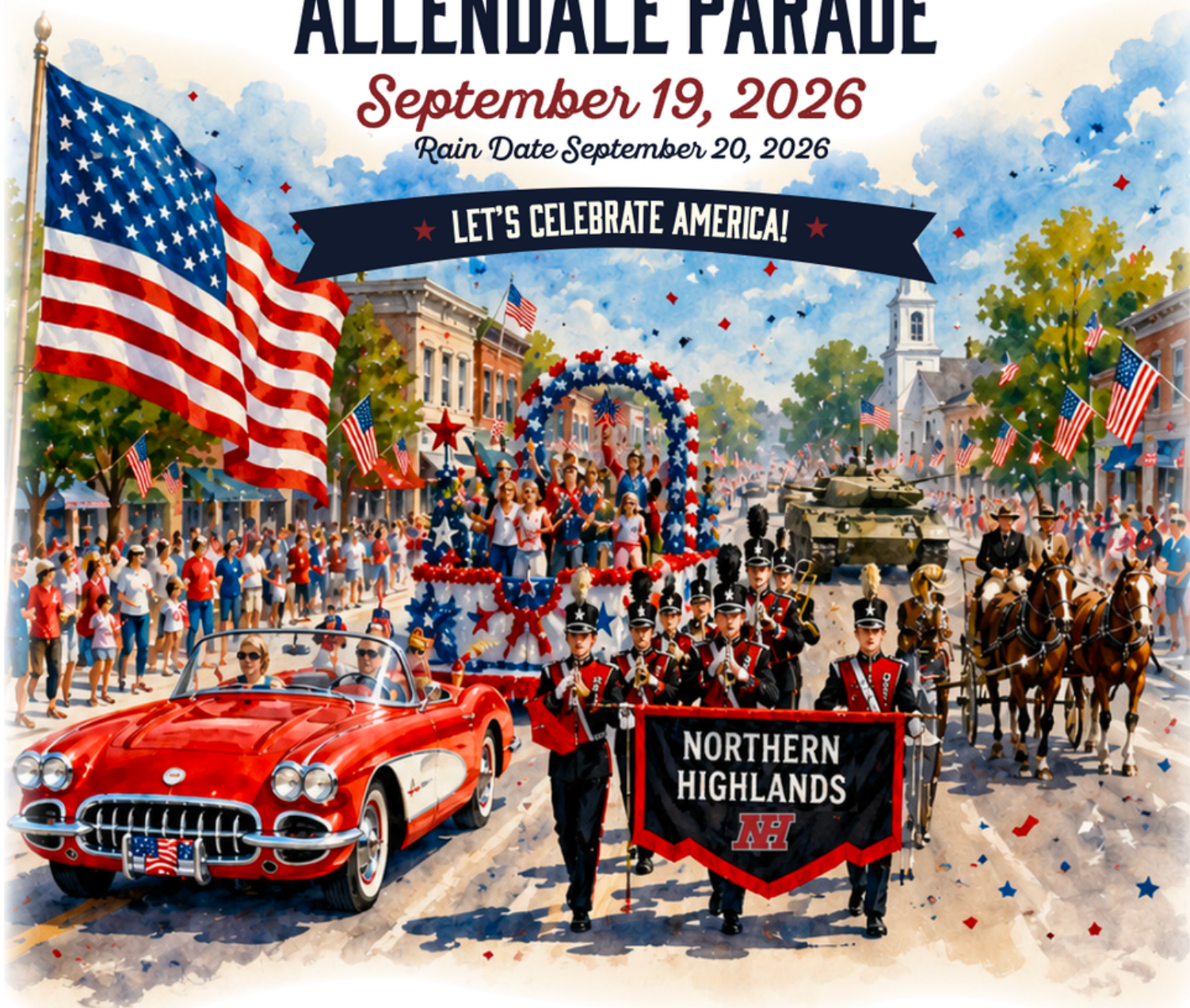
